AHR HEAL RATES CASE STUDY

Patient presented with right buttock and right ischium pressure ulcers/injuries. NPWT was initiated Sept. 23, 2018. The bridging technique was used so both wounds would benefit from NPWT. Patient used NPWT approx. 20 days of 29-day period (was in hospital seven days without NPWT).

► Actual heal rate measurements:

9/23/18

Right buttock 4.0" X 3.0" X 6.0" SW=12.0"
Right ischium 9.0" X 7.0" X 6.0" SW=63.0"

10/22/18

Right buttock 3.0" X 2.0" X 5.0" SW=6.0"
Right ischium 5.0" X 5.0" X 5.0" SW=25.0"

► As a result, both wounds benefited from NPWT:

Right buttock surface area decreased by 6.0" (50%) and decreased depth

Right ischium surface area decreased by 38.0" (60%) and decreased depth
